Getting started with Telehealth





This guide includes basic tips and instructions on how to join a video session, as well as some troubleshooting to make your first video call as smooth as possible. To help you prepare for your first session, please review the following information.

How do I access my Telehealth session?

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Your practitioner will send you a link via email or SMS.

At the time of your appointment, all you need to do is click on the Telehealth link provided in your email or SMS. The link will open your browser and contain the link to access your session. No additional logins are needed.

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When you are ready to start the session, click on the "Start Telehealth Session" button.

When you click on the button, Start Telehealth Session, you will see a picture of yourself in this screen.

Tip: We recommend starting your video session a few minutes early to test your settings.

Note: If your practitioner is finishing a previous session, there may be a slight delay in joining the session.

What equipment do I need?

To participate in Telehealth appointments from home, you need one of the following devices:

- Desktop computer with a webcam and speakers
- Laptop computer with built-in webcam and speakers
- Tablet device with built-in webcam and speakers

I can't connect to the Telehealth session

- Make sure your browser is up to date.
- Allow the browser to access your camera and microphone.
- Try reloading/refreshing the page. You and your practitioner may need to click the Start Telehealth Session button again. This is ok; the link will not be changed.
- Try using a different (and up to date) browser



Telehealth with Power Diary: Security, Privacy and Compliance

How does it work?

Telehealth uses WebRTC technology that is built into modern web browsers. This technology allows browsers to securely send and receive live data to each other without passing through third-party servers.

What this means is Power Diary creates secure Telehealth 'rooms' for each client, along with a special key to access the room. When you and your practitioner enter your rooms, Power Diary introduces your room and your practitioner's room to each other. This happens automatically and usually in less than a second. The two rooms then develop a secure, encrypted, and direct connection with each other, which allows your video session to begin.

Your session with your practitioner is not being streamed via our servers or any other media streaming service. This not only helps ensure optimal video quality but also ensures that your session remains private and confidential, just between you and your practitioner.

To further enhance security and privacy, no information or secret key to access your room is shared with other parties.

Are Telehealth calls encrypted?

Yes, Power Diary's Telehealth functionality is a peer-to-peer connection encrypted endto-end.

Is Power Diary's Telehealth functionality compliant with the Privacy and Security principles of my country?

Yes, Power Diary's Telehealth functionality has been designed and built to comply with the privacy and security requirements of countries in which we operate, including Australia, United Kingdom, United States of America, Canada, South Africa, New Zealand, and countries within the European Union (and European Economic Area).



Q. What should I do if I don't get the link with my reminder text or email?

A: Contact our office as soon as you have received your reminder so we can send it through to you.

Q. Where is the best place to do a video call?

A: Ensure that you choose a place that is private and free of any distractions. Set up your device or camera so that it has a clear, unobstructed view of you. Don't sit too far from (or too close to) the camera.

Adjust your light:

A: Make sure you don't have too much light behind you. Do not sit directly in front of windows.

Update your browser to the latest

Q: Is Telehealth private?

A: Just like a face-to-face consultation your Telehealth session is private and confidential.



Most connection issues related to telehealth are resolved by updating your browser to the latest version. The method for doing this varies depending on your browser. Typically, you'll be able to find your browser version and update it in your browser's Help or About menu area.

Enabling Your Camera and Microphone for Telehealth

If you are unable to get the audio and video working when starting a Telehealth session, it might be because your browser doesn't have access to your computer's microphone and camera.
